


Phonics/Reading in Year 1

- Daily 45minutes Phonics teaching and learning
- Daily phonics interventions -1:1tutoring for targeted pupils
- Daily Whole Class Reading(WCR)-45minutes
- Daily Read Aloud sessions-15mins
- Daily whole class interventions- teaching to read longer words
- RWI Phonics videos shared with children every Friday-Weduc, Marvellous Me
- Oxford Owl story books
- BUG club online reading
- Book bag books-black and white books, story books
- Library books
- Regular assessments to challenge them further and close identified gaps
- Additional interventions to prepare for the checks-daily fast-paced 5 minutes blast in the morning and 10 minutes blast in the afternoon





What is Phonics Screening Check?

 The Phonics Screening Check is a word reading test at the end of year 1.

Children read 40 words.

Who is it for?





All children in Year 1 throughout the country will be taking part in a phonics screening check in June.

Why do the children have to be tested?

The Phonics Screening Check is designed to confirm whether individual children have learned phonic decoding and blending skills to

an appropriate standard.






When is the test?



The test will start week beginning Monday 9th June 2025.


Please ensure that your child is in school during this week and on time.





- The test contains 40 words. They consist of a list of 20 Real words and 20 Nonsense words (alien words)
- The Nonsense words are shown with pictures of aliens so that the children will know they are nonsense words
- Each child will sit one-to-one and read each word aloud to their adult
- The test takes approximately 10 minutes, but the screening takes as long as the child needs

What are Nonsense or alien words?





These are words that are phonically decodable but are not actual or words with an associated meaning. Example brip, snorb.

Nonsense words are included in the check specifically to assess whether your child can decode a word using phonics skills and not their memory.

What happens if a child struggles with the screening check?

 The screening check will identify children who have phonic decoding skills below the expected level for end of Year 1 and for those who need support.

• The school will provide extra help for children who do not pass the checks to prepare them to re-take the test in Year 2.

Is there a pass mark?

- ■The check is not about passing or failing but checking that appropriate progress is being made.
- ■It ensures that teachers understand which children need support with decoding.
- If children do not reach the required standard, then the teacher will be in touch with parents to discuss plans and offer additional needed support to ensure that your child can catch up.
- ■In previous tests, 32/40 indicates that the child is working at the expected standard. It may change this year.

How would the results of the screening be used?

The school will inform you of your child's progress in Phonics and how he or she has performed in the screening Check towards the end of the summer term in July.

■ The school will also report your child's results to the Local Authority.
